The population primarily consists of young and middle-aged adults with acquired brain injuries caused by external force or by internal damage such as anoxia, stroke, disease, or tumor. There were also a large number of residents in long-term care and assisted living that suffer from progressive neurological disorders such as Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson’s Disease, and Huntington’s Disease, as well as congenital brain injuries and Developmental Disabilities.
